REPORT ON DOCUMENTS.

One hundred and thirty-two baptisms are reported.

Dogwood Grove and Six Mile Churches ask for the next Session of the Association to be held with them. We recommend that it be held with Six Mile.

Center Hill Church requests that the Association be held one month later; and that it commence on Friday instead of Wednesday. We recommend that no change be made.

We recommend that the 5th Sunday meetings as suggested at the last Session of the Association be continued, and insist that every church be represented in said meetings.

Renfroe, in reference to what he proposes to do as Editor of said paper, and that we do hereby signify our intention to encourage him, and our common cause, in the great work he has undertaken, by subscribing for, and reading said paper.

Report on Education was read, and Dr. G. A. Nunnally as previously invited, addressed the Association; setting forth the importance of education; the importance of having teachers thoroughly competent; having muscle, brain and moral qualities; urging that the recognition of the Bible as a text book was needful to the making of a true man, the reliable citizen and faithful christian. Lastly advocated and pressed the claims of Howard College for endowment, which resulted in pledges to the amount of \$710.00, cash \$26.00.

Report on Education adopted.

REPORT ON EDUCATION.

Your Committee report that the cause of education is more than ever engaging the attention of the people. One of the greatest evidences of this fact is noted in the call from all directions for professional teachers to establish permanent Grammar Schools.

We again commend to the Shelby Baptist Association, and to the friends of education generally, the Judson Female Institute and the Howard College, both located at Marion, Ala. These institutions are the property of the Alabama Baptist State Convention, and are doing a needed and noble work.

We note with special gratification, the splendid record of the Judson Female Institute, under its able management. This Institute was never in a more prosperous condition.

We are glad to announce that the Howard College, which without an endowment has so long maintained first rank among educational institutions in the South, is now absolutely free from debt, and can be endowed with perfect safety. And we would emphasize the importance of an immediate and liberal contribution to the endowment of the Howard College by our Association.

REPORT ON SABBATH SCHOOLS.

Your Committee to whom was referred the subject of Sabbath Schools, are unable to make a full and complete report, owing to the fact that very few of our churches paid any attention to this matter in their letters to this Association.

There is a grievous fault somewhere, and in order that this may be corrected, and suggestions offered, means and plans laid in the interest and for the promotion of this good and important object, your committee recommend that one half hour be devoted immediately to this subject, and a committee be now appointed to carry out the plans that may be devised, and make a full report at our next Association.

The Sabbath School cause in general was discussed for thirty minutes by Brethren E. W. North, R. W. Cobb, Howard Greggs, J. J. D. Renfroe and Geo. T. Lee; after which E. W. North, R. W. Cobb, and J. L. Peters were appointed a committee to carry into effect the plans as suggested by the above report.

The report of the Committee on Ministerial Education was read.

Dr. G. A. Nunnally, Dr. J. J. D. Renfroe, Geo. T. Lee and O. W. Ward discussed the subject; after which, the report was adopted.

REPORT ON MINISTERIAL EDUCATION.

That there is a growing interest among our people on the subject of Ministerial Education, no one will deny, though, for a long time neglected there has been a great waking up on this subject in the past few years.

During the present year thirty-seven brethren, preparing for the ministry in Alabama have been studying; nine in the Seminary at Louisville, fourteen in Howard College and fourteen in High Schools.

The demand for an educated ministry was never greater than now; and we recommend that pastors preach sermons to their churches on this subject, or bring the subject before the churches in some other appropriate way.

We also recommend that this Association encourage the young men in its bound, who feel impressed to preach by aiding them in securing a good education.

REPORT ON MISSIONS.

"Go teach all nations" is the Redeemer's great command. The Church of the Living God, as prompted by the ever Blessed Spirit, has, from the days of the Savior's sojourn on earth, sent forth the heralds of the Cross, upholding them by their means and prayers; and the result is, that now a large part of the habitable parts of the earth have a knowledge of Jesus, as the Savior of Sinners. But still the cry comes from Africa, China, Italy, Mexico, Cuba, &c., "*Come over and help us.*" Can those in whom dwelleth the love of God stand listlessly by, while this cry comes? *No, never, never*; if the subject is but properly brought before them. Here much depends upon the faithfulness of pastors in bringing this matter before their people. We would therefore recommend that pastors keep themselves posted in reference to what is being done and what is proposing to be done, in bringing the world to Christ; in order that they may be able from time to time to so present the claims of the Gospel in this respect before their people, that they may be prepared to act understandingly when they are prompted by a *Divine Impulse*.

But a small pittance is requisite to answer every demand; about twenty cents per member.

We would recommend a hearty co-operation with our Mission Boards.

We would also recommend that churches support their pastors so as to enable them to "give themselves continually to prayer and the ministry of the Word," in order that they may supply all destitution in their immediate surroundings.

REPORT ON AGED AND INFIRM MINISTERS.

We your committee think that no interest fostered by this body deserves more attention just now than that of looking after and supplying the necessities of the aged and infirm ministers.

We think that no benevolence is of greater worth, than that which supplies the necessities of those who bore the burden and heat of the day

through great trials; and brought us to what we are to-day as a denomination.

Dear Brethren, can we not adopt some measure or system by which we can procure means for this purpose? Respectfully,

And that said committee take in charge any funds that may be on hand and appropriate the same to the best of their judgment, and that they minister to the wants of any such, to the extent demanded by the facts:

Report of Committee on Temperance was read, and discussed by E. B. Teague, J. M. McCord, Geo. T. Lee, J. D. Martin and J. W. Wood.

Report adopted.

REPORT ON TEMPERANCE.

Dear Brethren, your Committee consider it unnecessary at the present time to make an extended report upon the subject of temperance.

It is now being generally known and felt that the traffic in ardent spirits will soon be a thing of the past. Our people are fast becoming convinced of the evils of intemperance and the great good derived from its suppression.

We deem it a cause of congratulation to the whole people within our limits that there is no place to-day within the bounds of the Shelby Association where liquor is sold, and judging from the growing sentiment now prevailing among the people throughout the State, we believe the day is not far distant when Legislation will place Alabama in line with others of her sister States who have banished the liquor traffic forever from within their borders.

We recommend unceasing diligence on the part of all christians in laboring for this end, and that prayer be made in this behalf to Him whose Hand is ever ready to give success to every right endeavor.
